ing...arguing...feeding...arguing again... Here are five simple tips to help decrease the chaos.

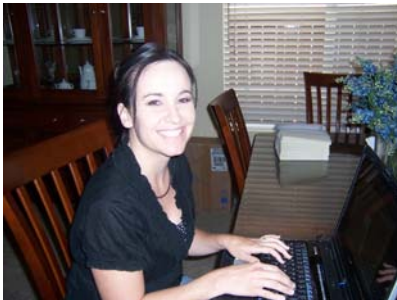
1. Have projects. Having an individual and family project gives focus and activity to unstructured time
