2020 wasn't what we expected, but the many obstacles we faced didn't change our determination or resolve to build resiliency and self-sufficiency within Inspire youth.

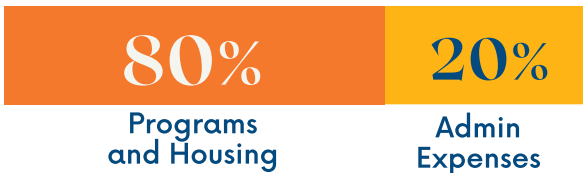

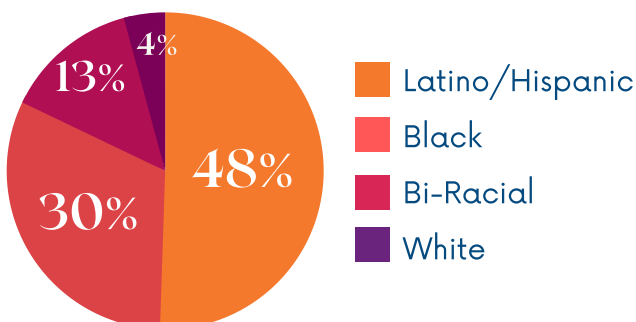
The COVID-19 Pandemic changed almost every area of our lives from staying home, to an uncertain employment environment, to grocery shortages, and the resulting mental health impacts. Our youth faced the same challenges, but together we rallied around them to ensure they had a family of support and that they had what they needed to adapt to changing circumstances. You provided hot meals and groceries to our homes to keep cupboards full, and provided the financial support to help our youth transition to virtual learning and receive the housing and support they needed.

OUR STUDENTS



6 students were ready to launch in 2020 including **1** Inspired Scholar who graduated with a BA and is now self-sufficient. **2** students completed vocational certificates.

At 18, Wendy became an Inspire youth. After heartbreaking pain and trauma, she simply longed for a place in a family. Her mentor immediately created a sense of belonging and supported Wendy as she worked through feelings of abandonment, all while pursuing her college education. Today, Wendy has graduated college, became a mom, and was legally adopted by the Brooks family. We are so excited for the Brooks family and the memories, support, and love that will continue to build generationally.



PROGRAM IMPACT

By providing opportunities in our three pillars: **Stability, Education and Employment, and Life Skills**, we help our students break the cycle of abuse and poverty.



100% of students found safe and stable housing with Inspire



10K in groceries filled our youths' pantries. Supporters delivered hot meals for our youth at this difficult time



25 life skills workshops were provided including a new job readiness series

90% of our students persisted in their virtual college education in the middle of the pandemic

100% of our students were employed in 2020, prior to COVID

Over **80** counseling sessions provided to our students
